The Grand Master's Message

I'll open with a remark made by Albert Einstein: "Religion without science is blind and science without religion is lame...The most beautiful and most profound emotion we can experience is the sensation of the mystical." Society today is enjoying a fascination with the mystical. Hence the unprecedented success of Dan Brown's book 'The DaVinci Code'. This book continues to be so successful that it was republished as a more expensive illustrated edition which has further added to its intrigue. I have a DVD titled 'Breaking the Code' in which Dan Brown states that while he would like to attribute his success to writing skills it is in reality the allure of the mystical which has captivated his readers. Although Freemasonry is mentioned we must be very careful not to be drawn into thinking that Freemasonry currently nor has it ever supported his particular metaphor of the Holy Grail. When combined with 'Angels and Demons' it does make a captivating read. His next book, 'The Solomon Key', will deal with Freemasonry's involvement with the formation of the American nation. At the Midwest Conference of Grand Masters last August we were treated to a video presentation by Senator Lee Sherman Dryfus, a 32 ° Freemason, in which he deals precisely with that subject and as well includes Freemasonry's involvement in spreading freedom and democracy around the world. It is a fascinating story and one I am certain will bring more very positive attention to our Craft The film 'National Treasure' also portraved Freemasonry in a positive light al-

though it too was just a story.

Locally the Craft has experienced yet more positive public relations through Bro. Frank Albo's research into the symbolism of our Legislative Buildings. He was initiated into St. John's Lodge No. 4 in early February. Bro. Frank spoke recently to a standing room only audience at the Fort Garry Hotel. He was also featured on a recent Vicki Gabereau show. This story will continue as the province will undoubtedly move to promote the Legislative Buildings as a tourist attraction. It is interesting to note that the George Washington Monument, which is widely known for its rich symbolism, was also designed by an architect trained at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris where Bro. Frank Simon, the architect of the Legislature, was educated.

All year I have stressed the importance of being prepared for the next wave of men joining the Craft to learn of the secrets and mysteries of Freemasonry. It becomes more apparent that they are indeed coming. Have you ever seen eighteen men presented with their Master Mason's aprons? What a thrill for everyone involved. These new Masons and the hundreds that are thinking of joining will demand meetings that inspire, educate and to borrow one of Dudley Davis' words, delight. They will expect unconditional friendship, a fraternity free from strife and petty bickering. They will want to learn our mysteries. Does vour Lodge provide an environment where they will grow and prosper? If we've not learned our lessons from the

past, sadly, history will repeat itself. By now the Lodge Education Officers will have seen the new EA course and with a little fine tuning it will be ready for your use. I do hope your LEO was present and will be ready to inspire you and your new EAs and others who would care to learn, with the mysteries concealed within the ritual.

The Grand Lodge of Alberta is celebrating their centennial this year. To assist in their celebrations the Conference of Grand Masters and Grand Secretaries of North America was held in Calgary from Feb 20th to 23rd. Freemasonry is alive and well in most jurisdiction south of the 49th and it is inspiring to hear of their successes. I attended a number of most interesting breakout sessions. Without going into any detail the ongoing public relations strategies were outlined and they will be built into our Strategic Plan. Our Kids ID program will have the opportunity to evolve and become a part of a North American strategy on Child Identification. This program, entitled CHIP, not only deals with child identification but also includes an educational section designed to alert children to and protect themselves from potentially dangerous situations. Grand Master's special one-day classes and alternatives to the traditional proficiency requirements were also discussed. There appear to be as many variations as there are jurisdictions. What a great opportunity to renew acquaintances, to make new friends and to share in the spirit which is driving us all onward and upward.

The shortness of a single year is becoming painfully obvious as June draws ever nearer and there are still many plans on my Trestle Board. I am so pleased that they are now also entrenched in our Strategic Plan and that we will not only pursue them to completion, but more importantly, we will continue to dream and then proceed to make those dreams too, become a reality. Our membership numbers may not yet reflect the spirit and enthusiasm that we are currently enjoying, but they will!
